6. Program Admission Requirements:

1-The student should hold a bachelor's degree in nursing science from Egyptian at least an acceptable grade (rate D).

2- The student should be available at least 2 days/ a week.

7. Regulations for progression and program completion:

- 1. Period of the study to obtain a diploma degree is one academic year divided into 2 semesters during which students devote themselves to study the theoretical and practical courses at least 26 credit hours.
- 2. The minimum duration of the study is two semesters and the maximum duration of the study is four semesters.
- 3. Students can study some bachelor's courses and not accounted within the approved hours of the diploma based on both council approval of both the psychiatric department and faculty.





- 4. Courses taught throughout the academic year for a minimum of 12 hours per semester. Students should attain exams at the end of each semester in the studied courses.
- 5. The students should be scheduled to final written exam at the end of finishing studying of each semester separately. The diploma exam is hold in January for first semester and in June for second semester.
- 6. The student who failed the exam must register again to re- study material and exam in the subject, in which he/she failed.
- 7. Eliminating the student's enrollment if they do not get a diploma in a period of three years from the date of registration including excuses or request a withdrawal form.

Evaluation system

100 score is calculated for each course and must break the score to the nearer score and is distributed as follows:-

- 1. Theoretical course that doesn't contain practical parts
- 20 % semester work
- 20 % mid-term exam
- 60% final written exam
- 2. Courses, which contain practical parts
- 10% semester work
- 10% the mid- term exam





- 20 % final practical exam
- 10% oral exam the end of the chapter
- -50% final written exam
- 3. Clinical / field Courses
- 20 % semester work
- 20 % mid-term exams
- 60% final exam

In all cases, the student must get 60% of the theoretical final exam's score in theoretical courses that don't contain or don't contain practical parts, and the final exam for clinical / field courses.

Each exam's hour is specialized for each credit hour so that at least two hours and not more than 3 hours.
