Course content: According to postgraduate (Master) by law

6. Program Admission Requirements:

- **1-**That the student holds a bachelor's degree in nursing from a university in the Arab Republic of Egypt at least a good grade or an Equivalent degree from a college or a scientific institute last recognized by the Supreme Council of Universities
- **2-** Have practiced nursing for a period not less than two years after the internship year of training in general or private hospital, or other Science Institute. Or have practiced or work as a demonstrator or clinical instructor in a university for a period not less than one year.
- **3-** Full time students are allowed to be enrolled at least for two years.
- **4-** Acceptance for study will be in one of the nursing specialties according to the approval of the concerned department with at least a good grade.
- **5-** The students will be registered in begin the study in second week of September, and begin the study in third week of September.
- **6-** The students will be achieve 48 credit hour classified into 42 credit hour successful achieved in their study courses, in addition to 6 credit hour the research project and the master thesis.
- **7-** The students will be allowed to register complete semester hours, in addition to some courses as well as 6 credit hour maximum.
- **8-** Pass an English language exam (TOEFL) with minimum score of 450 not to have been more than two years on the last evaluation.





7. Regulations for progression and program completion:

- **1-**They will not permit to attend the final written exam if they attend less than 75% of the clinical experience period.
- **2-** The students should conduct research on agreed topic by the postgraduate and research counsel of university based on the suggestion of department counsel the agreement of faculty counsel.
- **3-**Besides, presenting the research results should be through agreed master thesis from the judgment committee after discussion.
- **4-**However, it isn't agreed to present the thesis at least one year from the acknowledgement of registering the research topic by faculty counsel.
- 5- The students should be scheduled to final written exam at the end of finishing studying of preparatory and specialty separately. The success in preparatory is a conditional to enter the specialty exam. The preparatory exam is hold in January for first turn and in June for second turn. Whereas, it is hold in September for first turn, in January for second turn for specialty.
- **6-**The student who had absent or failed in certain subject, he should rescheduled for exam as a second turn in this subject and passed with minimum score. However, if student formally excuses for absenteeism, he will has the real obtained score. In addition, the student is considered fail bylaw when obtains less than 30% from written exam.
